0	You cannot put your own registration plates on a pre-owned/used vehicle without providing a Safety Standard Certificate which certifies a vehicle's fitness. It is valid for  days.
	2. If you are selling your used vehicle privately, you must buy a Used Vehicle Information Package to be shown to potential buyers.
	3. Automobile insurance is Compulsory in Ontario. You must insure your vehicle for third party Liability for at least \$200,000.
	4. It is illegal to drive a vehicle in dangerous condition. If your vehicle is found to be Unsafe, it will be taken off the road until the problem is fixed.
0	5. If you have been drinking and are involved in a Collision, your insurance company may not have to pay for Damages to your vehicle and your Medical costs may not be covered.
	6. It is illegal to Lend your licence; or to use an Altered licence; or to use another licence as your own. You cannot have more than One Ontario driver's licence.
	7. The Demerit Point/System encourages drivers to improve their driving behaviour and protects people from drivers who abuse the Privilege of driving.
	8. Broken lines that are wider and closer together than regular broken lines are called Continuity lines. On your left side they mean the lane you are in is Ending or exiting and you must change lanes to continue in your current direction.
	9. Yellow lines separate traffic moving in Opposite directions whereas white lines separate traffic moving in the same Direction
	10. A pedestrian facing a Flashing or steady Hand symbol should not begin to cross the road.
0	11. Warning Signs indicate dangerous or unusual conditions. They are diamond-shaped with a Yellow background with black letters or symbols.
0	12. Traffic signs give you important information about the law. They use different symbols, Colours and shapes for easy identification
0	13. In case of a Collision, it must be reported to the police when there are injuries or damages to vehicles or property exceeding \$2000
0	14. Switch to low beam headlights within 150 metres of an oncoming vehicle or when following a vehicle within 60 metres.
0	15. When emergency vehicles approach from either direction, with flashing lights, Bells or sirens on, you must immediately slow down, move safely to the far right, and Stop.
0	16. Do not park within 3 metres of a fire (H ydrant); within 100 metres of a Bridge; within 15 metres of a controlled intersection with (L ights) or within 15 metres of a level railway (C rossing).
0	17. You may drive on the right shoulder to pass a left-turning vehicle only if the shoulder is Paved.
	18. After passing a vehicle, change lanes only after you have seen the Front of the overtaken vehicle in your rearview mirror and have Checked over your right shoulder.
	19. You do not have to wear a Seat belt while backing up.
O	20. At pedestrian crossings never pass Any vehicle within 30 metres of the crossover.
0	21. Letting another vehicle go first in traffic is known as Yield the Right of way.
	22. Controlled intersections use Traffic lights, Stop signs or Yield signs to control traffic.
O	23. Where there are no posted speed limits, the maximum speed is 50 km/h in built-up areas and 70 km/h elsewhere.
Ō	24. Whenever following another vehicle, leave enough Space to stop Safely if the other vehicle brakes suddenly.
	25. Turn on headlights one-half hour before Sunset and keep them on until one-half hour after Sunrise.
